First reading: Wisdom 12.13, 16-19 The Lord shows mercy

The Mystery of faith. All: We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your resurrection, until you come again.

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper of the Lamb. All: Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

The priest will then hold up the Host to the Congregation and say audibly "The Body of Christ" to which the people

should together respond "Amen." In the same way, he elevates the chalice and says, "The Blood of Christ" and again the people respond "Amen."
