Pray Brethren that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.

All: May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

Sanctus: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Mystery of faith. All: We proclaim your death, O Lord, and profess your resurrection, until you come again.

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are called to his supper of the Lamb. All: Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

The priest will then hold up the Host to the Congregation and say audibly "The Body of Christ" to which the people should together respond "Amen." In the same way, he elevates the chalice and says, "The Blood of Christ" and again the people respond "Amen."

*The painting of St John Henry Newman with Blessed Dominic Barberi has now been installed in the Newman Gallery. This painting depicts the reception of St John Henry Newman into the Catholic Church on 9th October, 1845. On the left is Blessed Dominic Barberi, an Italian missionary priest (Passionist order) and on the right is Saint John Henry Newman. The location is Littlemore, near Oxford. Dominic Barberi had travelled to Littlemore by open coach in bad weather, which is why he was warming himself by the fire (centre; the fire is also a symbol of the Holy Spirit). To the right is the desk and quill pen Newman used to write the book, *An Essay* on the Development of Christian Doctrine. In 1846 Newman moved to Birmingham, where he first lived at Maryvale (the original Oscott College) and then later he moved to Hagley Road to found the Oratory of St Philip Neri, which still stands today. With the encouragement of Bishop Wiseman, Newman was ordained a Catholic priest in 1847. Newman was made a Cardinal in 1879. When he died in 1890, 15,000 people lined the streets of Birmingham. Barberi was beatified by Pope Paul VI in 1963. Newman was beatified by Pope Benedict on his visit to Birmingham in 2010 and canonised by Pope Francis on 13 October, 2019 in Rome.
