Faith and Finance-Briefing 3



In the bible there are 2300 verses on money and possessions and in Jesus' teachings, money often features, including eleven of the thirty-nine parables. For example, the parable of the rich man ('Dives') and Lazarus (Luke 16.19-31 – see image above of Lazarus). Lazarus is poor and wretched and ignored by the rich man. He feeds on the crumbs that fall from the table. Then, at death, there is a divine reversal. Lazarus, a name which means 'God helps', is truly helped by God to attain paradise, whilst the rich man is in the underworld, thirsting. It is a disturbing parable, because it makes us think of injustice in the world and our part in it. Lazarus is invisible: how often are the poor and needy invisible to us?

Pope Benedict XVI in his inaugural homily said *"each of us is the result* of a thought of God. Each of us is willed. Each of us is loved. Each of us is necessary." This is a profound truth.

If we are so attached to the things of this world, we are in danger of pride and in danger of being blind to the needs of the poor and of being servants of God.

Jesus says you can't serve God and mammon (Matthew 6.24f), so as we arrive at Pledge Sunday, help us, Lord, to respond generously. As St Ignatius Loyola put it, *"Lord, teach me to be generous, to give and not to count the cost".* 

Pope Francis has said that the Church *"is in the world to make possible an encounter with God's love. For this to occur, we must go out from our churches and parishes and find people where they suffer".* 

We have been looking throughout this project at how our giving can be: **\*proportionate** (that is, up to one tenth of our income) **\*regular** (that is weekly or monthly through envelopes or standing order) **\*sacrificial** and **\*cheerful** !
