Dear Parents,

Holy Week 2021. Rather unusually, school is in session during Holy Week this year. This week tells the story of Jesus arriving into Jerusalem amidst much fanfare and waving of palms. However, within a week he was arrested, crucified, died and rose again for all of us. It is a remarkable story that without which our school and parish family would not exist. Next week school will suspend the normal timetable; each class will devote their time and work to the events that make up Holy Week. In advance I would like to thank Mr Barton for organising the week and to Father Simon for his input. In the past we have been able to invite families into school for prayer services, sadly due to the restrictions we are not able to do this in 2021. <u>Sacrament of Reconciliation 2021 for Y3.</u> On Monday, Y3 will make their First Confession. Unfortunately, due to restrictions only Mr Barton and I can be present. Please keep all the children in your prayers as they take their first step on their journey to receiving Jesus for the first time in June/July.

<u>Coronavirus/National Day of Remembrance</u>. This week in school, we have marked 12 months since we were first asked to go into lockdown. Since then so many families have













been deeply affected and are continuing to grieve for the loved ones they have lost. The children made and recited prayers and spoke openly about how lockdown has affected them this week. Indeed, as a school community the return to school this time has been more challenging, with lots of families and staff dealing with a number of different issues. As a country, we seem to be making our first tentative steps back to some kind of normality however, I felt it was very important that we stopped and reflected earlier this week, and thought about all those people that have been so tragically affected by Coronavirus. School has erected a plaque in the prayer garden in memory of those no longer with us and each year the children can use it as a focus of remembrance. <u>FSM Vouchers.</u> The vouchers will be emailed out in the final week of term (hopefully on Wednesday 31<sup>st</sup> March) to eligible families. The vouchers are eligible for the two weeks of the Easter break. The office will text relevant families as and when the vouchers will be accessible.

<u>New Head teacher.</u> The governors have now begun in earnest the selection process for a new Head teacher for our school. Father Simon will write to everyone next term when any decisions have been made.

Mrs Heslegrave/Ms Parkes. When school returns after the Easter break Mrs Heslegrave and Ms Parkes will be working predominantly from home. Coronavirus guidance has informed school that every precaution must be taken with those expecting babies and if possible, they are to work remotely. As a result, Ms Winchurch will be teaching Y1 in the summer term whilst Ms Travers is returning from her maternity leave to take Y2. Ms Parkes and Mrs Heslegrave will still "be around" however, advice is that they should now start to reduce contact. Both are expecting their babies before we break up for the summer holidays and I know you will join with me in wishing both of them the very best at this most special of times.
