Fr. Simon writes: Monday (2nd March) is the Feast of St Chad, Patron of the Archdiocese was born in 620 AD and 672 AD). St Chad was educated at Lindisfarne in Northumbria and he was a pupil of St. Aidan. He completed his training in Ireland. Chad was a monk and began his ministry by being in charge of a monastery established by his brother in Yorkshire (Lastingham Abbey). He was later consecrated Bishop of York. He served as Bishop of York for a short time but in 669 AD he became Bishop of Mercia, centred on Lichfield, which was a vast Diocese. He was much loved by the people who knew that he loved them too. He died in 672 AD. His relics are buried in the shrine at St. Chad's Cathedral.

MERGER NEWS NO.6

Thank you to all those who came to our Merger Consultation meeting on Saturday 6th February. We had a full discussion on a number of important matters. Thank you also to Graham Green for chairing the meeting and to Wendy Gasson for taking the Minutes. At the Parish Pastoral Council meeting held on 10th February, Jackie Scott, who chairs the Merger Advisory Group, presented a report to the Parish Pastoral Council who in turn gave their approval to the following further steps:

(1) Further Consultation on a new name for our new parish when the merger by fusion of CTK and OLAM takes place

On the weekend of 7th/8th March there will be a second and final consultation on the new name for our newly merged parish. To reemphasise: this has no impact on the names of the actual buildings we use for our places of worship in CTK, OLAM or SMM. It is a new name for the new united community that gathers across those places of worship. This is the new united community which the merger will form. Having looked at the feedback from the September consultation, we realise that a second consultative vote is needed. The aim is to draw up a shortlist which we can present to Archbishop Bernard who alone has the power to decide which one we ought to have. The long list published previously had one name added to it following the invitation and encouragement to do so in Merger News No. 5. Consequently, the final long list is:

St John Henry Newman (on its own), St John Henry Newman **and** the Sacred Heart - Blessed Dominic Barberi - St. Augustine of Hippo - St. John of the Cross - St. Francis of Assisi - St. Francis de Sales - St Thérèse of Lisieux - St. Pier Giorgio Frassati - St. Padre Pio - St. Alban (11 names)

This is how the consultation will be conducted:

- As you come into Church at any of the Sunday Masses on 7th/8th March, all 11 names will be up on a board at the entrance to the Church.
- All members of the congregation who are in Year 7 in secondary school or older will be given a sticker to place against ONE name on the list.
- The short list will then be drawn up according to which names receive the most votes.
- The result of this consultative vote will be confirmed in a future newsletter and will then be included in the petition..

(2) Opportunities to review the Petition

The Petition is the formal document which has to go to Archbishop Bernard to set the canon law wheels in motion. It is a request for him to pray, reflect and come to a decision regarding these matters. We, in fact, need two: the first for the merger by fusion and the new name; the second for our proposal regarding the future of our parish buildings. Each petition sets out the rationale for the request. **The draft petition relating to merger/change of name only** will be available for inspection after all Masses on the weekend of 21st/22nd March and before the evening Mass on 25th March. The aim is to present the final version to Fr. Simon so that he can sign it and send it to the Archbishop and other relevant parties very shortly after Easter Sunday.

(3) The future of our Church on Old Oscott Hill

Regarding the second petition relating to the place of worship on Old Oscott Hill, it is now accepted that the current building no longer serves our purposes and that a move to a smaller, warmer one is what we need. The hope is that by retrenching, we will end up with a better platform from which to offer pastoral care in the Maryvale area of the Cluster. The Merger Advisory Group and the Parish Pastoral Council offered various suggestions about this to Fr. Simon. Last weekend the following announcement was read out on Fr. Simon's behalf explaining the current situation: **"In order to accurately ascertain the value and potential plans for Maryvale House including the OLAM site, the Archdiocese will begin a marketing exercise starting this week, which will help us plan ahead"**. The Archdiocese has this week confirmed to Deacon Gary that the exercise to which Fr. Simon refers has now begun.

Information about Holy Week; To prepare for this all-important week in the Church's calendar, please note the following:

- **Sunday 22nd March** (Lent V), meeting after the 09.30 Mass at CTK for any young people wanting to plan for the Youth-led Stations of the Cross on 27th March at 7 pm at CTK.
- **Saturday 28th March:** beginning at 09.30 at CTK with a second part at OLAM, there will be a rehearsal for Holy Week for all altar servers covering **Maundy Thursday (3rd April – at CTK)** and the Easter Vigil on **Holy Saturday Night (4th April at OLAM)**. The servers will be bussed between the venues. New servers are welcome provided they are over 7 and have already received their First Holy Communion.
- **Foot washing on Maundy Thursday (19.30 at CTK):** we need 4 people from each parish within the Cluster. Please sign up on the sheet at the back of each Church. Watching in Prayer will take place in the Chapel of Repose from the conclusion of the Mass of the Lord's Supper until 6 am on Good Friday morning. Please sign up for the watch for an hour so that is a continuous cycle of prayer.

Mass Intentions: Following on from previous notices, we can now confirm how we will manage the allocation of Mass Intentions. **Where a specific date has been requested**, we will do our best to allocate the requested Mass to that specific date. However, since there are no regular public Masses on a Thursday and now only four Sunday Masses, we are no longer able to guarantee that we can offer the Mass as a public Mass on the date requested. **This is why we need you always to put your contact number on the Mass envelopes so that we can contact you about it.** Fr. Jude says a private Mass in the Presbytery Chapel every weekday. It is not possible for members of the congregation to be there when he does. However, a Mass intention can be offered. If you are willing to have Fr. Jude say the Mass in order to guarantee the date, then write "Fr. Jude" on the envelope. You will be notified of the date privately. **If no specific date has been requested** then these Mass intentions will be allocated in the following way: if any can be allocated to Fr. Jude, they will be. Otherwise, they will be sent away in batches of 50. We currently have over 200 Masses still to allocate. The first batch of 50 will go to the Vicar-General for him to allocate to retired priests of the Archdiocese who need support. The second batch of 50 will be sent to Fr. The in Taiwan. The final batch of 50 will be sent to Fr. Nazary Njiku, a priest in Tanzania known to Deacon Gary. Fr. Nazary desperately needs support for his mission there. We will repeat this as necessary. In this way, we will be supporting priests both at home and abroad in keeping with the principle of Christian solidarity and at the same time continue to pray for our faithful departed. We will be notified when the Mass has been celebrated. Please see below for details of other services to remember our loved ones.

Remembrance of our faithful departed: Now that Masses are to be sent to other places for celebration, we need to have another service within the Cluster to provide an opportunity for remembrance and prayer. The first such service will be on **Thursday 26th March at 7 pm in CTK.** It will be based on the Office of the Dead from the official Prayer of the Church and will include the naming and lighting of candles for all those loved ones we are remembering. The hope is that we can make it a monthly event and circulate the venue around all three places of worship in the Cluster.

Ministry of Holy Communion: the Ministry of Holy Communion has two aspects - the distribution of Holy Communion within Mass and the distribution of Holy Communion outside Mass to our sick and housebound parishioners. Following discussion at the Parish Pastoral Council last Tuesday, it has been agreed that with effect from and including Maundy Thursday (2nd April), communion under both kinds (the Sacred Host and the Precious Blood from the chalice) will be offered both on Maundy Thursday and at all Sunday Masses thereafter. We shall be calling upon existing Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion to assist us; but we also need new recruits. As regards, Holy Communion outside of Mass, we are VERY short of Ministers. We do not currently have enough people to cover all those who are currently expecting visits. Please do think carefully and consider whether you can help. Any of the parish clergy will be able to let you know specifically what is involved. The time commitment can be adjusted to whatever you have available. Potential new ministers will need to have a training session with Deacon Gary.

Ministers of the Word: *All current commissioned* Ministers of the Word are earnestly requested to attend a meeting with Deacon Gary on 18th March 2026 at 7 pm in the Guild Room for a review of how the Liturgy of the Word changes during the Sacred Triduum and a discussion on how this impacts their ministry. *Any potential new* Ministers of the Word are invited to attend the necessary formation sessions on the following dates (all in the Guild Room at 7 pm): 4th March, 11th March. Current Ministers are also welcome to attend these both for a refresher and also to give those entering the ministry the benefit of their practical experience.
