

Curriculum Intent

At St Margaret Mary RC Primary School, we have designed our curriculum with the intent that children must have the building blocks to become successful adults. The curriculum is all the planned activities that the school organises in order to promote personal growth and development. This encompasses a wide range of subjects: English, Mathematics, Science, Computing, Art, Design & Technology, Spanish, History, Geography, Physical Education, Music and Religious Education.

Programmes of work are planned within the guidelines and requirements of the National Curriculum. We believe children learn better through a stimulating and imaginative curriculum which encourages curiosity and creativity. Reading is at the heart of our learning.

Our curriculum aims to engage pupils in their learning whilst developing knowledge and skills so they can achieve their very best. The curriculum includes not only the formal requirements of the National Curriculum, but also the range of additional opportunities that the school organises in order to enrich the experiences of our children.
