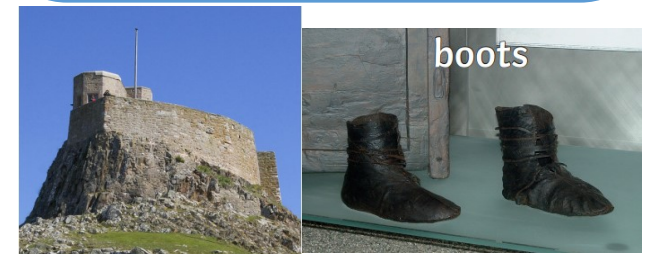

### Key Vocabulary

<b>Anglo- Saxons</b>	People from the North of Europe who settled in England in the fifth Century.
<b>Artefacts</b>	A man made object such as art or tools that is of cultural or historical interest.
<b>Chronological</b>	The order in which things happen, from beginning to end.
<b>Invasion</b>	The movement of an army into a region or country, ready for conflict.
<b>Longboat</b>	A narrow open vessel with oars and a square sail, used in Viking times.
<b>Navigation</b>	How ships find their way from one place to another.
<b>Raiders</b>	People who enter a place by force in order to steal something.
<b>Settlement</b>	A place where people decide to live.
<b>Trade Links</b>	Buying and selling of goods and materials around the world.
<b>Transportation</b>	Methods people use to move themselves and goods from one place to another.

The Vikings came from Scandinavian countries of Norway, Sweden and Denmark. They left on expeditions to raid and settle in Britain. They were great traders and skilled in farming and hunting.



### KEY VIKING FACTS

- Vikings didn't wear horned helmets, they used horns for drinking vessels.
- Vikings buried their dead in boats, surrounded by weapons and valuable goods.
